
NEW YEAR'S HOOP WALL HANGING





DAP RapidFuse Adhesive
Scissors
Several types of ribbon
Wooden numbers (optional)
String (optional) to hang the numbers
Metal hoop from the craft store
Scrapbook paper - we chose a gold glitter paper



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. First cut your ribbons between 38" 42" long each. We cut our ribbons different lengths so they weren't all exactly the same length once added to the hoop, for visual interest.
- 2. Next, cut out some flower and leaf shapes. For the larger flower, we cut two exactly the same. In order to secure the large flower to the hoop, we applied RapidFuse to the back of the flower, placed it on top of the hoop, and pressed the second of that same shape, behind the hoop and applied pressure to adhere them together. This way, your two shapes are sandwiched around the metal hoop. Glue the leaf to the flower once the flower is adhered to the hoop. The second flower and leaf can be glued on after the ribbon is knotted to the hoop.
- 3. Fold each piece of ribbon in half. Put the folded center of the ribbon under the bottom of the hoop, and thread the tails of the ribbon through the loop to create a knot. The hoop is slippery, so we used a dab of RapidFuse on the knot to secure the ribbon and keep it from slipping undone.
- 4. If you choose to add numbers, or letters, hanging from the center of the hoop, use RapidFuse to glue the tails of a piece of string to the back and knot it to the hoop like the ribbon below.
- 5. Add your final flower by applying RapidFuse to the back of the flower and pressing it on top of a few of the knots of ribbon. Adhere your second leaf to the flower once the flower is firmly glued in place.
